- Park Center Senior High and North View Junior High are public schools in the Osseo Area School District 279.
- We are an authorized (August, 2007) IB Middle Years Programme.
- Grades 6 through 9 are at North View and grade 10 is at Park Center.
- All North View students and all 10th grade students at Park Center participate in the IB Programme.
- Demographics:
 - .5% American Indian or Alaskan Native
 - 87.4% Asian/Pacific Islander
 - 5.3% Hispanic
 - 36.3% Black, not of Hispanic Origin
 - 30.5% White
- Over 35 countries are currently represented in our school community.
- World language, either Spanish or French, is required of all sophomore students.
- More than 03 sports and extra-curricular activities are available.
- Students may take High Performance and AP classes in many subjects.
- Park Center has a 6 period day with intervention periods added on Tuesday and Thursday.

In addition to offering an authorized IB Middle Years Programme to all sophomores, Park Center is currently in the process of becoming a Diploma Programme school. We are in the authorization phase at this time.

In 2007, Park Center was awarded a significant federal grant, through the Northwest Suburban Integration School District, to create a whole-school Global Studies Magnet. Using grant funds, parents, students, and teachers at Park Center are currently involved in creating a high technology, globally connected magnet school. With partner schools on 4 continents, infrastructure to conference with students anywhere in the world and a collaborative, technology rich student-centered environment, Park Center will become a magnet school focused on student participation for the interconnected world of the future.
