Cyber Village Academy is a 4th-8th grade public charter school that offers rigorous educational opportunities for students from throughout the metro area. Centrally located on St. Paul's Energy Park Drive, CVA has pioneered a hybrid approach that is unique in the United States: students spend three days in classes on campus and two days at home on-line each week. This dynamic fusion of on-campus and on-line learning helps students develop collaborative skills while also learning to manage their learning using technology tools at home. The school appeals to students who want the flexibility of an on-line program, the group interaction of an on-campus learning environment, and the personal attention that a small school can offer.

CVA is an authorized IB Middle Years Program World School. The school's Middle Years Program serves all students in grades 6, 7, and 8. All students take classes in each of the eight MYP subject areas each trimester during each of the three years. This means that every 6th-8th grade student has classes in Arts and Music, Spanish, Physical Education, and Technology in addition to Mathematics, Science, Language Arts, and Global Studies every week throughout each school year. The school's curriculum emphasizes thinking skills, research strategies, international outlook, and a multiple perspective view of knowledge. Field trips and journeys extend the curriculum for application outside school and home. Journeys to Space Camp and Mexico take place every other year. Eighth-graders go on an annual retreat to Eagle Bluff near Lanesboro, Minnesota prior to their graduation from the school. Planning is taking place for a journey to China. Extra-curricular opportunities are available after school and on Thursdays and Fridays during the school year and include Student Council, Mandarin Chinese, Future City Competition, Robotics, Chess Club, Newspaper, Yearbook, Quilting, Arts Club, and Set Design. Outside of school, CVA students are involved in skating competitions, instrumental music and dance performances, sports, and theatre. All CVA students are involved in community service and present their experiences and reflections annually in the CVA Community and Service Fair. Tutoring and a study center are also available on-campus to all students on Thursdays and Fridays.

CVA's teachers' dedication to providing a world-class education is obvious to the school's parents who identified the faculty as the number one reason for staying at CVA. All teachers are trained in the MYP program and continue to upgrade their MYP training annually. All teachers share high standards both for their students and for themselves. Results are evident in the school's test scores, student projects, annual choral concerts and musicals, and performance on national academic competitions. "My children need the academic challenge that the program offers," said Lisa Gale, a CVA parent. "The program has an international emphasis while at the same time insisting that students learn their local and national history, language, and culture. This approach is especially crucial for coming generations of youth who will live in an increasingly interrelated world."
