St. Anthony Middle School (SAMS) is a public school in the St. Anthony-New Brighton District #282. St. Anthony-New Brighton School District, which serves the city of St. Anthony Village and a portion of New Brighton, is located six miles northeast of downtown Minneapolis. Our District serves over 1700 students at Wilshire Park Elementary School (grades K-5), St. Anthony Middle School (grades 6-8) and St. Anthony Village High School (grades 9-12).

We are an authorized (August 2009) IBO World School offering the Middle Years Program (MYP) in grades 6-8. All SAMS students participate in the IB Program. We provide a strong academic background while still offering students a variety of elective courses. As part of the Middle Years Program, which focuses on preparing students to be citizens in an interconnected world, students enroll in one semester of Spanish in sixth and seventh grades and a full year in eighth grade. Enhanced learning opportunities, extracurricular activities and clubs are available to St. Anthony Middle School students and include athletics, speech, student council, academic teams and drama.
