**I.B. Teaching Staff**

Currently, 19 teachers are involved in teaching I.B. courses for juniors and seniors. All of the I.B. teachers teach other classes outside of the I.B. curriculum. Many other teachers are involved in teaching the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade courses that help prepare our students for the I.B. program.

**Student selection process**

After receiving information about the I.B. program during their freshmen and sophomore years, students self-select whether they want to be Certificate candidates or full I.B. Diploma candidates. We encourage as many students as possible to take I.B. courses. After explaining the rigor of the diploma program, any student may attempt to earn the I.B. diploma.
